



Access & Flow Follow-Up: Northern Zone

Report from Spring Forum Large Group Engagement

November 7, 2018

- June 2018, a series of table top group activities were conducted during the Spring Forums.
- Interdisciplinary groups were tasked with reflecting on the day's presentations, and sharing:
 - what they personally could *start* doing,
 - what they should *stop* doing, and
 - what they should *continue* doing...

... in order to improve care to individuals who transition across the continuum of care.

 Participants were also asked what they would take away from the presentations, and what they felt they still needed to know.



Major province-wide themes:

Respondents want: Communication

- Better communication among the different players in the care team.
- Everyone to take responsibility for their work, and to stop assuming they know the realities of each other's roles.
- Shared language and tools to aid communication.
- Clear information and direction, and data-informed decisionmaking.



Respondents want: **Collaboration**

- Cooperation and collaboration between roles must be facilitated and enhanced at the provincial, zone, and local levels.
- Better communication and information sharing with clients/families and the public on expectations of care.
- Information sharing and collaboration between roles across the continuum of care.
- Information sharing at transitions.



Northern Zone

START

- Commit to improving communication and information sharing across sectors/between partners in care
- Restart CC Zone meetings

STOP

- Making assumptions about client/patient/resident preferences and roles of other professional/sector (and talking about it)
- Making assumptions that others we are communicating with know and understand our programs

CONTINUE

- Continue to have CC networking meetings that had been held biweekly but have been discontinued for at least 2 years for Cumberland – these were wonderful networking opportunities
- This type of forum DHW/DCS/Acute/Continuing Care/Home Care

- More about accountability and responsibilities
- System metrics they better tell the whole picture

Next Steps:

- Provincial working group to identify barriers/silos and figure out how to take them down timelines/actions
 - Health authority
 - Govt DCS/DHW
 - Employers
 - Patient/family reps
 - Clinicians
