

## Home Care Services: COVID-19 Assessment for Clients and their Caregivers Unable to Access PAC

## **Guiding Assumptions and Principles**

- The Department of Health and Wellness is responsible to maintain home care standards.
- Different agencies across Nova Scotia (VON and NSHA) provide home care nursing services to clients.
- In-home assessment processes apply to clients who cannot access a Primary Assessment Centre (PAC) criteria for appropriateness is defined in the screening tool
- EHS provides an assessment service to those at home in parts of Central Zone and Eastern zone – VON and NSHA nursing will support the other geographic regions of the province for which EHS will not be providing this assessment service
- Continuing Care performs intake function and authorization to the home care nursing provider to deliver in-home COVID-19 assessment; 811 provides referral
- Caregiver or family who lives in the home may also be swabbed if they meet the screening criteria. (For example, full time caregiver unable to leave the client for safety reasons.)
- Client will be assessed to determine if *Red Flags* are present, which may require assessment and treatment at Secondary Assessment Centre or COVID ward.
- Care is taken in preventing or controlling infections:
  - o Deliver care by implementing (as per <u>Home Support Screening Guidelines</u>):
    - Routine Practices (see Point of Care Risk Assessment).
    - Droplet & Contact Precautions if indicated.
    - Proper use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
    - Ongoing observation of client's health, symptoms, change in behaviours, etc.
  - o Follow IPAC Home Care Guidelines.
  - Scheduling staff to minimize contact with other clients where possible.
- Processes related to specimen collection, transportation, and delivery (including requisition and supply procurement) will be developed by Continuing Care management team, and will be documented and attached to this document.
